From the Desk of the Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint Thomas,

On November 1st, the Church celebrates the feast of All Saints. We give thanks to God for the lives of the saints, the men and women who showed us how to live a life of holiness. The lives of the saints, the official saints of the church and the unofficial saints in heaven, encourages us to take up our crosses daily and follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Furthermore, many saints because of their conversion from being great sinners, give us hope and reassurance that God's mercy and forgiveness is offered to all. It is never too late to travel the road of holiness. Who is your favorite saint? How does he/she inspire you to live the gospel?

On November 2nd, the Church Commemorates the Faithful Departed, All Souls Day. We remember our family, friends, and all who have died, and pray they may forever rest in the peace of heaven. The tradition of setting a day aside to remember the dead, goes all the way back to the second century with the church father Tertullian. Once again, we will remember our deceased family and friends through our Book of Life, which is now in the Narthex for you to list your loved-ones so we can pray for and remember them. November is a month to give thanks. We give thanks for the saints and all the faithful departed who are now our intercessors in heaven.

Our annual Christmas Party will be Saturday, December 9, at 6:00 pm. I am asking for a few volunteers to help me plan and organize this wonderful event. Please see me if you are interested.

Deacon Imani has safely returned from our annual church synod which was held in St. Louis last weekend. I was told it was a very informative gathering. Great enthusiasm was expressed toward the mission of our larger church, the ECC-USA. We are blessed to be a member of such a caring and gospel driven Church.

After both masses the weekend of November 12, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be offered. The sacrament is a powerful source of strength and grace for those who suffer from illness or advanced age. The sacrament is ancient in origin. We read in the epistle of James: "*Are there sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and let them lay hands on them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick persons and their sins will be forgiven them.*" Those suffering from serious illness, those preparing for major surgery and those of a weakened condition due to age are suitable candidates for the reception of this sacrament. Likewise, those who suffer from emotional and psychological trauma should present themselves to receive the sacrament. I should add that the Sacrament of Anointing should never be confused with what was formerly referred to as "extreme unction" in the sense of "last rites." Due to ignorance, former clergy of Saint Thomas would refer to this sacrament of healing as the "last rites" leading to confusion. Also, the sacrament may not be administered to someone who has passed. The purpose of this sacrament is to offer the sacramental grace and prayer of the whole Church for those who are sick.

Please continue to keep St. Thomas Church in your prayers.
